- > chest, abdominal pelvic wall fluid aspiration or drainage
- > extremity lesion biopsy, aspiration or drainage
- > palpable lesion biopsy, aspiration or drainage

### **For Providers**

• Need to hold blood thinners: no

• Need to hold other meds: no

• Need to be NPO: no

• Need blood work: not routinely checked (if checked - platelets  $\ge 20k$  and INR  $\le 3.0$ )

• Receive moderate sedation: no (just local anesthetic)

## **For Schedulers**

- Requirements in For Provider section also apply.
- Need imaging/radiologist review: yes (except thyroid FNA recommended by St Vincents Radiology and seroma aspiration/drainage do not require approval)
- Need H&P: not required but preferred (does not have to be within 30 days)
- Need a driver: no
- Need bed in Short Stay / PACU: no
- Need an IV: no
- Arrival time: 30 mins prior to appointment
- Stay after procedure: leave immediately after procedure
- Rads that do procedure: Agrait (MA), Byra (BY), Carter (CA), Cohen (DC), Combs (JC), Edwards (JE), Hoffman (RH), Howard (JH), Parsons (CP), Rezaei (AR), Roth (NR), Sherard (DS), Taylor (IT), Wood (CW)
- Order needs to specify side (right/left) and site (if applicable).
- If for diagnostic aspiration/drainage, order needs to specify what fluid labs are needed.
